

Nearly all are Western Americana related, though there are a few nautical items. There are also many keepsakes and limited edition printings from the Book Club of California and the Friends of the Bancroft Library, as well as a nice selection of works by John Muir including one extra-illustrated and signed.

Though Hill is best known for his magnificent collection of Pacific Voyages, now housed at the University of California at San Diego, he was an active and important collector in many fields. An excellent sketch of his life can be found in "Kenneth Evan Hill as a Book Collector, 5 December 1915 - 8 July 2001," by Jonathan A. Hill, part of the introduction to the second edition of *The Hill Collection of Pacific Voyages at the University of California, San Diego* (New Haven: William Reese Company, 2004).

First edition. The product of worry over Mexico's potential entry on the German side during World War I, the work describes the principles used to capture and occupy a foreign city, in this case, in Latin America. The document provides a general statement, general principles and objective, the architecture and general characteristics of Latin-American cities, and action of the occupying force (preliminary arrangements and the details of occupation, etc.). "In any warfare instituted against Latin-Americans our troops will encounter a mode of defense rather foreign to modern tactical teachings and more in accordance with medieval times. These people pursue a style of warfare which consists primarily in the attack and defense of cities. A campaign is seldom executed with the object of destroying the enemy's army. The loss of a city hurts the prestige of the government and the morale of the troops more than the losses of battle." The lessons of this urban warfare were no doubt forgotten before and during the early stages of the Iraq War. This pamphlet may have been used in the curriculum for the Command and General Staff College (CGSC) at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas and was provided to National Guard troops in 1916 (see The Saturday Evening Post, 1916, - Volume 189, Issue 1 - Page 34). Benjamin Alvord, Jr. (1860-1927) was promoted to brigadier general and was the adjutant general of the American Expeditionary Forces during World War I. Scarce. First edition. "The first recorded visit to Yellowstone Park was made by John Colter in 1810 when he took refuge there from hostile Indians. No one believed his story of what he saw there, nor did they believe that of the next visitor, Joseph Meek, in 1829. Finally, in the 1850's the region was described in considerable detail in the writings of Father DeSmet, the famous Jesuit missionary, who had obtained most of his information from the mountain man, Jim Bridger. In 1859, Capt. W. F. Reynolds led a government expedition to the area, but it brought back little information and was discredited by a public dead set on not believing what was there. Finally, in 1870, N. P. Langford and H. D. Washburn led a well-equipped, thorough expedition that not only established the facts about the region but also led directly to the creation of Yellowstone National Park on March 1, 1872. Langford was appointed the first Superintendent of the Park, which was the Federal government's first program for preserving any extensive area of the national lands for public use. The magnificent park included over two million acres in Wyoming, Montana, and Idaho, and included some of the most beautiful and breathtaking area in the country,' Jenkins (JJ100-299). First edition. An authoritative account of the mineral resources of the United States west of the Rocky Mountains; later expanded. Most of the volume relates to the mines of California and Nevada. There are also two appendices important in their own right: Randolph's Address on the history of California, and Dwindle's Address on the acquisition of California by the United States. First edition. Bunnell's narrative is the principle source of information about the discovery of the Yosemite Valley by the Mariposa Battalion who were led there by fleeing Indians in March, 1851. While Farquhar acknowledges that Walker's 1833 expedition and occasional gold rush miners had probably glimpsed the valley, its "discovery" is credited to the Mariposa Battalion whose activities Bunnell documents for the first time. Bunnell's work is the cornerstone treatise on the discovery of the Yosemite Valley. Provenance: From the library of Kenneth E. Hill, with his bookplate.
