

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



First edition. Major-General Sir James Edward Alexander (1803-1885), army officer and explorer, traveled to the Balkans during the Russo-Turkish War of 1829, and received the Turkish order of the Crescent (second class), those experiences forming the material for this, his second work. The illustrations are by Fenner and J. Clark; after J[ames] E[dward] A[lexander]. Some scattered foxing, mainly to initial leaves and map, spine mildly rubbed, but otherwise a near fine copy. 

First edition. The exquisite plates are "copied from a series of engravings begun at Petersburg in 1776, and finished in 1779, under the care, and at the expense of C.W. Müller" (preface). They range over the Russian peoples in the 18th century including: seventeen plates of the Finns and related tribes; eighteen of the Tartars; fifteen of the nations of the Samoyeds and fourteen of the Kalmuks, Mongols and other smaller tribes. A later, more common edition, appeared about 1823. Minor foxing to the title page else a fine bright copy. [40268]





First edition. Two versions of this catalogue were produced, one without plates, and this, the illustrated version, with carbon prints by James Craig Annan (1864-1946), son of the Scottish photographer Thomas Annan. Annan was only 18 when he produced this series of prints (uncredited) for the spectacular Duke of Hamilton sale. There were 2213 lots auctioned over fifteen days in five sections which brought in 397,000 British pounds! In addition to the paintings offered, which could have easily formed their own museum -works by Botticelli, Breugel, Da Vinci, Durer, Fra Angelico, Giorgione, Holbein, Rembrandt, Rubens, Titian, Van Dyke, Veronese, and more- there was French furniture, Asian bronzes and lacquers, Sevres and Desden porcelain, and decorative objects in profusion. Photographs were somewhat new to illustrating auctions and "this is an early use of photography for a sale catalogue," according to William Buchanan in his "J. Craig Annan. Selected Texts and Bibliography," (Oxford. 1994), p. 137. Annan would go on to become an important British pictorial photographer and one of its master photogravure printers, contributing both his own work and gravures for other British photographers to Stiglitz' Camera Work (the January 1914 issue -no. 45- was devoted entirely to him). 



Part 1, Cabala, mysteries of state" and part 2, Scrinia Sacra; secrets of empire, in letters of illustrious persons;" each have separate dated title page, pagination, and register. "Professes to give impartially all the materials of the secret history of the last years of James, and the earliest of Charles, and especially those



concerning the actions of Buckingham, the 'Subtleties of Spain,' and the 'Practises of our Home-Roman Catholics, and of some of those who were called Puritans then.' Among the papers of interest new to the public were Bacon's Considerations concerning the Queen's Service in Ireland (undated) and a large number of letters from him and others to Buckingham. 

Editio nova. Prepared under the direction of John Pearson, Anthony Scattergood, Francis Gouldman, and Richard Pearson. Vol. 1, pt. 1. Genesis and Exodus; Vol. 1, pt. 2. Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy; Vol. 2. The historical books and the book of Job; Vol. 3. Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon; Vol. 4. Books of the Prophets; Vol. 5. Critici Sacri was intended as a companion for the Polyglot Bible, published by Bishop Walton, in 1657. Combining the works of many of the best English and continental scholars of the sixteenth and seventeeth centuries, John Pearson, archdeacon of Surrey at the time, produced "the most important collection of Biblical

critics ever made....In point of size the work of Poole has advantages but no man man who is acquainted with both works will ever prefer the Synopsis to the original," (Clarke, Holy Bible, 1837.) Contains the entire annotations of Munster, Vatabalus, Castalio, Clarius, Drusius, and Grotius on all or nearly all of the Old Testament, Fagius on the Chaldaic Paraphrase of the Pentateuch, and the first four chapters of Genesis; the commentaries of Masius on Joshua; Codurcus'; annotations on Job; Pricaeus on the Psalms; Bayne on the Proverbs; Forerius' commentary on Isaiah; Lively on Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, and Jonah; Badwell on the Apocrypha; Hoeschel on Ecclesiastes, and more. For the New Testament, there are the collations of Valla, with the animadversions of Revius, Erasmus' annotations, commentaries Vatabalus, Castalio, Clarius. by Zegerus, Grotius, Munster, Drusius, Scaliger, Casaubon, Cameron, Lud.Capellus, Jac. Capellus, Gualtperius, Schultetus, and Pricaeus. Also included are philological tracts and dissertations including John Gregory's Notes and Observations; Fagius's Comparison of the principal Translations of the Old



Testament; Cartwright's Mellijicium Ebraicum; Drusius on the Mandrakes; Jos. Scaliger and Amama on Tythes; Lud. Capellus on the Vow of Jephthah and Corban; Pithoeus De Latinis Bibliorum Interpretationibus; Hosti- us De fabrica Arcae Ngae; Rittershusius De Jure Asylorum; A Hat ius De Engastrymutho; Montanus on Jewish Antiquities; Bertram and Cunaeus on the Hebrew Republic; Waser on the ancient Coins and Measures of the Hebrews, Chaldeans, and Syrians; and much more. This is the second and best edition, much augmented from the first of 1660. Typographically, as well as textually, the work exceeds that of the first Englsh edition having been the concerted effort of six Dutch publishers and booksellers (five from Amsterdam and one from Utrecht), with at least two doing the bulk of the printing including Hendrik Wetstein. Contains a rare variant of Benedict Arias Montanus' Sacrae Geographiae Tabula double hemisphere world map from the Polyglot Bible, showing how Noah's three sons repopulated the world; this version is unique in containing two scene: one of Sunlight and the Garden of Eden and one depicting the darkness and the deluge. 

Second printing. Joachim Bouvet (1656-1730) was one of six Jesuits sent by the French King Louis XIV as missionaries to China. Bouvet and his associates were commissioned to carry on astronomical observations, to determine the geographical positions of the various places they were to visit, and to collect various scientific data. The Jesuits were well received by the Kangxi Emperor. Bouvet stayed at Peking, teaching the emperor mathematics and astronomy and later served as the emperor's envoy to France. "Bouvet describes the emperor as an absolute but wise and humane ruler, a superb administrator, a valiant soldier and avid hunter, a brilliant intellect, a diligent scholar, a paragon of personal morality, and the protector of the Jesuits," Lach & Van

Kley (Asia in the Making of Europe, Vol. 3, Bk. 4, p.1680). First published a year earlier, this issue carries the same title and pagination as the 1697 printing. While OCLC locates fourteen copies of the 1697 printing, it shows only three copies of this edition: BN France, Caen U Droit Lettres, and School of Oriental and African Studies, Univ. London. Occasional toning, some wrinkling, older inked underlining on a few leaves, old mark removed from title page with small repair to verso, still about very good. [40265]



First edition. The first and only substantial monograph on this most important French Art Deco and modernist architect, designer, furniture maker, and sculpture (other than two very short works by George Waldemar in 1948 and 1956). Arbus (1903-1969) trained at the Ecole des Beaux Arts, Toulouse and at his family's cabinetmaking workshop. His career as an architect took off when his design of a single family house was exhibited at the 1937 International Exposition. A beautiful production. We could find no other copies bound in leather offered at sale or auction. Faint rubbing to rear board else a fine copy in original raw cardboard slipcase. [28103]

First edition. "Noveaux melanges d'archeologie, d'histoire, et de litterature sur le moyen-age" was preceded nearly two decades earlier by the equally valuable "Melanges d'archeologie" also containing four quarto volumes of illustrated dissertations on gold and silver churchplate, enameled ware, carved ivories, tapestries, bas-reliefs, and paintings belonging to the Carlovingian and Romanesque periods (ninth to twelfth century). Contains: 1: Curiosities mysterieuses 2: Ivoires, miniatures, emaux;; 3: Decoration d'eglises; and 4: Bibliotheques. Original paper wrappers bound into rear of the last volume which has a different marbled board pattern (no doubt purchased separately as the last volume was issued two years after the third). Spines and boards rubbed, extremities worn with loss of paper to the corners of two boards, some minor splits at the hinges, scattered foxing, bindings tight, leaves crisp, overall a very *good set.* [26377]

Editio postrema. Stefano Guazzo's Civili Conversatione ranks with Castiglione's Courtier as one of the most popular and best known books during the Elizabethan period. Written in the form of a dialogue between Annibal Magnocabello and Guglielmo Guazzoand, a Knight who has grown weary of court life, the work addresses the need for balance in life, covering topics such as education, family life, society, public behavior and morality. First published in Brescia in 1574, over ten editions in Italian alone were printed by 1621. In 1579 two independent French versions were out and both were reprinted many times. Based on the French, Pettie's translation into English appeared in 1581 (and it has been argued it was a source for Shakespeare); there were in the meantime German, Dutch, and Spanish translations as well as two into Latin, the first by Coggerman (1585) and the second by Salmuth, which was much reprinted thereafter. The first was in 1596, the second, which according to Lievsay was 1598 or later, undated but listed as "secunda." The third was in 1602. This copy is dated 1598, but does not have the words "secunda" but "postrema." OCLC lists only three copies, but a forth is at the Bibliothek Erlangen. Ruled and beveled vellum boards are dated 1601. First edition. A broadside announcing a new constitution and proclaiming the creation of the Republic of Cispadana. The Cispadane Republic (Repubblica Cispadana) was a short-lived Napoleanic state, founded in 1796 with the protection of the French army, led by Napoleon Bonaparte. A preliminary draft of a constitution was began in January 1797 and worked on by a 'congress of the people' from January 21 to March 1, 1797. As a flag, it chose a tricolor (of red, green, and white), Italy's first. Bonaparte demanded additional changes to the constitution, including the abolition of a clause restricting the principle of equality: needed was "An absolute equality and understanding in the spirit, in virtue and in physical strength, in luck, in education, and good fortune to all men." In July the Republic was merged with the Transpadane Republic,

forming the Cisalpine Republic (which was gone by 1802, merged into the new Italian Republic, also formed by Napoleon. In 1805, following Bonaparte's assumption of the title of Emperor of the French, the Italian Republic was transformed into the Kingdom of Italy [Regno d'Italia]). Reporting that the vote was in favor of the constitution, the broadside notes that "after abolishing tyranny, we have achieved without revolution, a new government... [and] ...we have a solemnly sanctioned social pact, we will soon have a stable government, legal representation, a body of magistrates, and public functionaries elected by various 'comitia' of the people." Very rare. The constitution itself shows a few institutional holdings and later reprints, bit this announcement is a different story; we could locate no copies at any North American or European Libraries. One of only 250 copies. "...elle est assez recherchée," Brunet. Didbin wrote "The popularity of Brunck's edition was very great; and was exceeded by no work to which that celebrated name



was attached. But the dearness of the quarto edition prevented many from purchasing it. Brunck, therefore, brought out an octavo edition, in three vols. 1786-8: containing the Scholia and indexes, fully as complete as the quarto. 





He is particularly full on the great Attic masters, and introduces, 'not as a comical divertisement for the reader, but as a necessary supplement to the life of Socrates,' a blank verse translation of the Clouds of Aristophanes," (Britannica. 11th Ed). Derived from Diogenes Laertius, Alcinous, Aristotle, and other ancient sources, the work is more biographical than critical. "At the time of its publication, the field which it covered was almost untrodden ground," (Sandys, J. E. A History of Classical Scholarship, III, p. 351). The History of Philosophy "was accepted as a standard authority for many years," (DNB) and went on to be published again 1701 and 1743, and was translated into both French and Latin. First published with a slightly


different title in Delf in 1655, the work went through two more editons, a second in 1858-1861, and this, the third, a year later. OCLC shows nine copies, all but one in the Netherlands. First edition and first French edition. Wittich's original work on fortification and defense with Duparcq's French translation. Each version contains a copy of the single plate [51x45 cm (1840) and 60x48 cm (1847)]. Wittich was a Prussian Artillery Major. Deparcq was Chef de Bataillon of Engineers in the French Army, Professor of the Military Art in the Imperial School of St. Cyr, and considered one of the best military writers of his day. Either version is quite scarce. We could find only 2 copies of the German edition, at the Het Legermuseum and the BL; and 2 of the French, at the BN and Biblioteca Torino. A very good copy with the bookplate of the Military Order of the Loyal Legion of the United States, Commandery of the State of Illinois on front pastedown, shelf sticker on foot of backstrip, boards rubbed with some loss at one corner, short contemporary notation on rear pastedown.
